Dear Friends.

I must confess that it seems somewhat odd, in the middle of February, and after just the first Sunday in Lent, that before you read the next Circuit Rider, we will have already experienced the darkness of Holy Week and the joyful celebration of Easter. It seems, this year, the season of Lent will speed by in no time.

I am praying that you each will take some time during this season to contemplate our theme "what r u up to?" And even more, I'm praying you'll be energized by thinking about what God is UP to in your own life, in our church, in our community, and in our world. There is SO MUCH that God is doing, and so many ways that you are participating in that important work, without perhaps even being aware of it.

Your participation in Sunday worship inspires and uplifts those around you, in ways you might not even imagine. Your consistent presence is a witness to God's goodness and faithfulness, beyond that of even your own. When you participate in any of the outreach and mission efforts of our church, by helping prepare the meal of Friday night Soup and Bread, or by making sandwiches for the folks in need in Willimantic, or by attending an event to learn more about our neighbors, and ways we might invite them into our family, or by attending a brainstorming meeting to discuss creative ways to enhance our financial well-being, while providing opportunities for our neighbors to be involved in our ministries, you live out God's call to truly BE the Church, and to share God's message of love, grace and care, and you lay another stone in the path to our church's future as a beacon in this community.

Every time you call someone you haven't seen in church for a week or two, or visit someone who is lonely, or attend a Board or Committee meeting, or teach our children in Sunday School, or support the work of Inspired by South Africa, or contribute your time and energy to making the Strawberry Festival, or Summer Dance Fest, or the Harvest Fair, or the Hamburger Booth, or any of our many ministries successful, you are making our church visible as an important resource in our community, and you invite others to share in what we have found here.

Surely God is up to even more than all of this, and I'm excited for your future – each of your futures, and your shared future as a family of faith.

Perhaps the most impactful thing and exciting thing God is doing right now, is stirring in the heart and mind of your next Pastor and calling them already to embrace a new opportunity in ministry here, and to call Lebanon their home. I invite you to be in prayer with me for that Pastor, and for our Search Committee members, as they are about the vital, and sometimes challenging work of discernment about "what God is UP to" in preparing for the next chapter of your continuing and unfolding story, as we each and all approach the wonderful gift of new life at Easter.

May your hearts and spirits be buoyed by God's love and faithfulness!


Instead of bemoaning what we can't do, or used to do, in a culture where "measuring up" to external standards seems impossible, this Lent we will celebrate the small things that we can do right
