Vacation Bible School 2024

VBS 2024 was a resounding success! A total of 60 campers from surrounding towns (Amston, Canterbury, Chaplin, Columbia, Coventry, Lebanon, Mansfield Center, Moosup, North Franklin, Willimantic, and Windham) attended. Eight different churches were represented, as well as many campers who did not identify with any church. The ages of the campers ranged from pre-K to ninth grade. The largest number of campers were from fifth and sixth grade (18), with an even distribution between pre-K and 4th grade. In preparation, Mary Horan and Teresa Waldron met with 19

enthusiastic youth leaders (most were previously VBS campers) in the late spring to develop a theme and decide on crafts, songs, and games for the week. They chose "Created to Care!" as the theme. From July 22-26, the campers participated in crafts and games, heard stories at the Jonathan Trumbull library, and learned new songs. They baked cookies for the Lebanon seniors, and then personally delivered them to the Senior Center via a wagon ride provided by Jeanna Prink. At the end of each day, the group gathered in the sanctuary, sang beautiful songs, and shared God-sightings. Joy and caring were evident throughout each day and between all the campers and youth leaders. The week concluded with a new event, VBS Sunday! All campers and their families were invited to join our congregation for a service focused on VBS with a picnic following. The VBS campers, and members of our church and the First Baptist Church of Lebanon, showed that they were indeed "created to care" by raising \$2141 for Heifer International. A "Joy to the World" package will be purchased to provide a family in need with one heifer, two sheep, four goats, and a bundle of seeds. The remainder of the money raised will go to provide education, clothing, and warmth to others through Heifer International. Many thanks to all who volunteered their time and talent to Vacation Bible School this year!
