A Note from Rev. Amie



The power of imagination can be both inspiring and daunting. As we collectively explore the limitless potential of our ministry, we are invigorated by the possibilities. This Stewardship season, we are embarking on a journey of shared vision, envisioning a future where FCCL can make a profound impact.

Over the next few weeks, we will embark on a journey of reflection and imagination. We will examine our current ministries and explore potential new avenues for service, guided by God's vision for our faith family.

October 13th We "Imagined Together: A World Made Whole." Together, we explored our current response to climate change and God's call to steward creation, and imagined how we might expand our efforts in the future.

October 20th We "Imagined Together: Enough at Every Table." Aware of the widespread food insecurity in Connecticut, we examined our faith family's current efforts to address this need. We also considered how God might be guiding us to deepen our commitment to alleviating hunger.

October 27th We "Imagined Together: A Sense of Wonder." Looking to nature as a reflection of God's generosity, we can cultivate a mindset of abundance in our daily lives.

November 3rd We "Imagine Together: A Rested Church/Community." Anxiety and Exhaustion may cause us to lose sight of God's still speaking voice working in, through and among us This week, let's explore ways to find rest in God and draw inspiration from Jesus' teachings, allowing us to renew our energy and fulfill our faith family's mission.

November 10th We "Imagine Together: Vitality." "Vitality expresses a quality of life that is full, animated, and enduring, with the capacity for continual growth and development. The capacity for growth and renewal is essential to healthy and thriving relationships, vocations, and churches. Over time, and as we age — ourselves and the institutions we may serve — a kind of spiritual calcification can set in. We can get stuck and stagnant, not only resisting that which is new, but perhaps even fearing it (Imagine Together: Vitality UCC Stewardship series; exegesis: John 3:1-10, 7:45-52, 19:38-39; By Rev. Dr. S. Chapin Garner)." What ways do we imagine vitality being renewed within us, opening our faith family to live out God's call fully animated and enduring?

November 17th We "Imagine Together: Community of Belonging." Stewardship is not only the act of collecting and discern how to distribute resources, but also how we interact with each other to build a sense of community that is both inclusive to those within the community as well as inviting to those seeking community. How do we imagine becoming more inclusive and inviting? What discernment might we engage that will prepare us to create that sense of communal belonging?

November 24th We "Imagine Together: A Sense of Awe." While we often associate knowing God with the works of Jesus Christ, it's important to remember that prayer, wonder, and awe offer powerful avenues for experiencing God's presence in our lives. Through prayer and meditation, we can become attuned to the love and compassion shared in the world's broken places. These moments of awe and realization reveal the true essence of stewardship. How can we cultivate more space for these moments to inspire us to serve as stewards of God's creation?

I am excited to imagine along with all of you where this journey will lead. Stewardship, as we will discover together, is spiritual practice that opens us to God's love, grace, and compassion leading us to be God's presence in the broken spaces of our world. Imagine where this journey might lead us!

Hopefully the Halloween bash will be a success, and the kids that attend will be excited with the event.



Quilt Drawing





Advent Bible Study:


"The Heat That Grew Three Sizes: Finding Faith in the Story of The Grinch" By Matt Rawle

"Whether you've read the original Dr. Seuss's How the Grinch Stole Christmas! As a bedtime story, gathered the family together to watch the television special, or hit the theatres for one of the movie adaptations, you know how this story never seems to leave our imagination. Maybe it makes you think about the commercialism of Christmas. Or maybe it makes you think about yourself (The Heart That Grew Three Sizes: Finding Faith in the Story of the Grinch, Bible Study Leaders guide, p 7)."

In this Bible study, author Matt Rawle guides us through a fresh examination of the classic Christmas story. He invites us to rediscover the Advent season in innovative and thought-provoking ways. Through the lens of The Grinch, we'll delve into the realms of literature, art, and entertainment to explore how God's redemptive story is woven into our lives and the world around us.
